

Family Council Rights

Your Rights

Federal and state law gives many rights to nursing home residents. The law includes the following requirements for resident councils. When asked by the family council, the facility must help notify residents and family members about the council meetings.

Family Council Rights:

- A resident has the right to have family and friends meet in the facility with other family and friends.
- The nursing home must provide you with a private place to meet.
- Staff must chose a designated staff person to assist the council if needed.
- The nursing home must consider the views of the family council and act promptly upon concerns and recommendations.
 - The facility must be able to show their response and reason for the response.
 - This does not mean that the facility must approve every request of the family council.
